The Coronary Calcium Score (heart scan) is the only non- invasive test that can accurately detect—or rule out—the presence of heart disease in otherwise healthy individuals.

This fast and easy test is performed with a computed tomography (CT) scanner and special software to determine if the coronary arteries are blocked or narrowed by the buildup of plaque—an indicator for atherosclerosis or coronary artery disease. You simply hold your breath while the scanner passes over you. You won't even need to remove your shirt.

The heart scan's superiority to other risk assessment methods, like cholesterol and blood pressure, has been demonstrated in numerous clinical studies encompassing more than 20,000 patient years of observation. Additionally, the Society for Heart Attack Prevention and Education (SHAPE) and others recommend this test because:

- It has been shown to be five (5) times more accurate than other risk assessment methods at predicting which patients are at risk for coronary artery disease
- Information gained from the calcium score can more accurately identify patients requiring cholesterol-lowering therapy, helping to reduce instances of unnecessary, costly medication
- The test can also be used, over time, to effectively measure response to targeted therapy
